Using renewable energy locally

Fetlar Wind Ltd and Fetlar Developments Ltd held the official opening of the Fetlar Wind turbines and Fetlar Green Energy scheme on the 1st of July The scheme which is powered by Fetlar Wind's 2 x 25kw turbines provide heat and power to a small number of nearby properties including Fetlar Primary school on a microgrid. the official opening was performed by Darcy Cook accompanied by principal teacher at Fetlar Primary - Katy Hay (pictured below)



Following the opening everyone was treated to a light lunch and cakes at Fetlar Primary school.

Cruise Ship visits

A fantastic weekend of weather showed Fetlar at its best, for the visits of the cruise ships Ocean Nova and Hebridean Sky on consecutive days in May. Climate Challenge fund successful bid

Fetlar Community Association(Fetlar Hall) were successful in a recent bid to the Climate Challenge Fund. They have been awarded a total of £33679.10 for a number of initiatives which will all help reduce the islands carbon emissions.

The award of the grant will:

Enable reductions in energy use within the Fetlar hall and help to provide a sustainable, warm and fit for purpose building. These energy reductions will be achieved by fitting more insulation, low energy lighting, automatic lighting controls, draught proofing and the replacement of some windows in older parts of the building.

Help to reduce fuel poverty within the community through community engagement and energy advice. Helping to reduce household energy consumption and carbon emissions.

A pilot project that will produce 300kg of food in a community growing space at Houbie, supplemented by promotion of home/community composting, cookery courses, demonstrations and training in growing and reducing avoidable food waste.

Encourage consumption of more local seasonal local produce, through composting, food growing and cookery classes focussed on avoidable waste.

Community Growing.....

Following Fetlar Community Association's successful bid to the Climate Challenge Fund and the cooperation of a local crofter there will be space available for community growing this year.

Fetlar Developments Ltd are still working on the purchase of the land with the goal of also providing community polycrubs for people looking to grow more of their own food, allowing them to extend the growing season and also to grow a wider variety of crops.

As part of the pilot we have been kindly given the use of some land free of charge by local crofter Peter Coutts. With the help of crofter Tom Thomason and tractor, the ground was broken in a prepared to a state where it was ready for planting A group of the community

growers accompanied by pupils and staff from Fetlar Primary school planted several varieties of seed potatoes in the prepared community area. The plants are now coming on well and there have been several weeding sessions Many community members are involved in the project, whether it be with planting, watering, weeding or harvesting.

Once all the hard work is done and the crop harvested, we hope to have produced at least 300kg of potatoes from the community area, some of which will be used at a community event at harvest time.



Leagarth (Part 1)

Leagarth was built for Sir William Watson Cheyne around 1900 and is still in the ownership of the Cheyne family. Sir William perhaps Fetlar's most famous son, was an assistant to Lord Lister in the development of antiseptic surgery and later President of the RCS.



In its heyday it boasted a number of greenhouses heated by steam pipes from a boiler house, allowing tropical and other exotic plants to be grown. It could possibly be described as a 20th century forerunner of Cornwall's Eden Project.



As well as the greenhouses there was an impressive sunken garden. The gardens were often opened to other islanders on Sunday for them to enjoy. A number of staff were retained to look after the house as well as the greenhouses and garden. Some local people who worked at Leagarth also travelled with him to his other properties.

Sir William made available a part of the building which was regularly used by the community as a hall for many years. The community continued to use the building until 1985 when the present Fetlar hall, converted from an old church, was opened.

The family began restoration of the building in 2009. That work and the restoration of both the Peerie house and The lodge, both used originally as staff quarters, was completed in late 2015. The one remaining part of the building to be refurbished is

the area previously used as the community hall. It was used during the restoration as a temporary workshop and is now undergoing refurbishment.

The house is currently used by the extended family who visit Fetlar regularly but mainly during the summer months. The house has previously been opened to the public, during various open days.

Fetlar Interpretive Centre

Fetlar Interpretive Centre have implemented a new layout for 2016. For anyone who has visited before please note that our main entrance is now through what was previously the side entrance, which offers

disabled access.

We continue to offer card facilities for purchases, which has helped the sales of craft items and is likely to become a permanent service.

We are pleased to have both Jade and Frances working regularly as visitor services assistants and they have recently been joined for 1 day a week by Janet.

Free wifi is available and we are now hosting one of the new Vodafone stations giving 3G coverage to most of the village.

As our part in promoting low carbon transport we have installed an electric vehicle charge point. Which is part of the 'Charge Your Car' network. It is a fast charge unit which can supply 3 phase at 22kW but can also adapt to single phase and lower power ratings. This is currently free to use. But donations are always welcome.

Following on from the visits from the small cruise ships Ocean Nova and Hebridean Sky the first for many years. We are looking forward to the return of Hebridean Sky on the 17th of August. It is likely that we will be staying open later that night to cater for cruise ship passengers.

If you are planning a visit on the 17th we would recommend visiting early as the afternoon could be quite busy.
