Housing news

There have been a lot of properties on the market recently and they seem to have for the most part sold. We have also had a number of people arriving and some leaving. We are expecting a number of the new owners to arrive soon.

All change at the school.

The pupils and wider community were deeply saddened to say farewell to principal teacher Paul Gill who was without doubt one of the best teachers that Fetlar school has had. Paul took a leading role in the community being a founding Director of Fetlar Developments and latterly a Trustee of Fetlar Museum Trust and Director of Fetlar Wind. While Paul is moving onwards and upwards having been offered a headship at a school on mainland Scotland. It is likely that his skills and experience could have been retained in Fetlar or Shetland, save for the actions, or more accurately the inactions of our glorious education department. The community is now waiting to hear word about a replacement.



Fetlar Wind

Fetlar Wind was set up as a Community Benefit Society to raise the money for, and to build two turbines to supply power to the Fetlar Green Energy(FGE) project. Within the space of this year it has been set up, raised capital and is now in the final stages of getting its turbines operational. The new turbines should be commissioned by the end of this year. The turbines will be connected via a power management system to the FGE heat and power distribution system, which following testing should be fully operational by the middle of January 2016. It will supply connected buildings with heat and power and will also be used to charge the electric minibus making its operations virtually carbon free.



The Community Association who run the hall are looking to secure funding for upgrades to the building. These will include significantly increasing the insulation, some replacement fire doors and also adapting the building to provide appropriate toilet and shower facilities to complement the planned caravan/motorhome hook up points. Upgrades and/or modifications to the heating system to lower costs are also being considered.

Fibre for Fetlar- Broadband update

In collaboration with North Isles
Community Broadband, www.ni4cb.com
and with funding from Community
Broadband Scotland, we are hoping to
install a fibre network on the island. Initially
making use of the existing backhaul. This
will then allow almost instant speed
increases once an upgraded backhaul
link is available. It will also mean that users
will get a more uniform speed as some
people have suffered from the
degradation of the wireless kit. More detail

Community Polycrubs

We have now identified an alternative site near the B.A.R club shed which we can use to provide our community growing project. This will be moving forward in 2016 and there will be public meetings held in the new year both to gauge current demand and also to look at other potential aspects of the project, such as training, composting etc

Having secured funding and brought Brough Lodge back to a wind and watertight condition, the Trust is now seeking funding for the main phase of the project. They have also announced the development of a pilot scheme to promote hand knitting in Shetland schools. The Shetland Peerie Makkers project launched a successful crowdfunding appeal.
