Fetlar Festival of Film

As part of a peerie taste of Fetlar. Fetlar festival of film will be showing a range of films over the Saturday and Sunday.

Saturday starting at 2pm

The fesitval opens with the film Lowrie dines in Hillsook(Cert U). Based on the story by Joseph Gray it was made by Yell Film and Video Group as a project.

This will be followed at approx. 3.15 by Shetland Moving Film Archive with a selection of Shetland films from last century. Rovedehorn - a 13 minute film recalling the Norwegian Government's gift of a car ferry to Shetland. Including footage of the ferry's visit to Yell. From 1936 a 9 minute silent film on sheep dipping. A 15 minute 1945 silent film on sheep shearing, spinning and carding as well as knitting of the wool. Shetland scenes from 1956, 11 minutes, including a man making cowskin rivlins, fishing in Lerwick and Skerries lighthouse.

Then a 15 minute break followed by: The Fair Isle - A nineteen minute amateur film from 1951 detailing the work of the Fair isle Bird Observatory, the mail boat, the laboratory, bird trapping, ringing, catching fulmars, etc. Up Helly Aa festival 1949. A silent film 6 minutes long. Vikings of Shetland - A ten minute film from 1969 with sound. Finishing with - Snowy Owls of Shetland - In 1967 the first breeding record of snowy owls was recorded in Fetlar. The RSPB decided to mount a 24 hour guard and this film is a record of that highly successful operation. A 9 minute film with sound.

Sunday- starting 11.30am

Starts with the Pixar Film - Toy Story 3(Cert U)

1330 approx. The Edge of the World(Cert U) made by Michael Powell and filmed mainly on Foula in the 1930's

1500 approx. The Kings Speech(Cert 12), multi oscar winning British film by director Tom Hooper

17.10 approx. Local Hero(Cert PG) the timeless classic made by Director Bill Forsyth Finish time approx 1900.

There will be no fixed charge for the films but donations are welcome.
