Electric Community minibus

After several years of working towards this project, we have finally managed to get all the funding together to order the minibus. It is being made by Smith Electric in Newcastle, based on a Ford transit. Once completed it will travel up to Gleneagles, where it will be converted to allow disabled access, with space for two wheelchair passengers along with conventional seating. The minibus will be able to carry eight passengers in total along with the driver.

Sign up for a free farmland bird survey

Farmers and crofters in Fetlar are invited to find out more about what birds are on their land, courtesy of a free, confidential, no-strings attached survey.

This year is the final year of the RSPB Scotland Volunteer and Farmer Alliance project and the priority will be to deliver more surveys in Shetland, in particular in the North Isles.

The project is open to all land managers and participation is free. A trained volunteer will visit the farm or croft to survey the species of birds present during the breeding season. Participants will then receive a map of the birds recorded on their land and advice to help them target their management to benefit wildlife. The data collected can be very helpful in guiding and supporting Scottish Rural Development Programme (SRDP) Rural Priorities applications. It is also a chance for those already in agri-environment schemes to see how their management is impacting on birds.

Surveys depend on finding local volunteers. The RSPB is therefore looking for surveyors in the North Isles with bird identification skills who are willing to spare three mornings during the breeding season to survey a local croft or farm. No survey experience is required and training will be provided. This is a great opportunity to use your bird identification skills to promote farmland birds and wildlife conservation amongst your local community.

Annie May Robertson, Fetlar's oldest resident, sadly passed away recently, only days after her 95th birthday. She is survived by her son in law Alex, grand daughter Marianne and husband Robert, great granddaughters Lisa and Debbie and great grandson Brydon. Born in 1917 Annie May, who was nothing less than a Fetlar institution, was brought up at Baela along with her sister Helen and brother Jeemie. She initially entered service with Rev Campbell at a very young age before moving to Edinburgh to take up a housekeepers post at a doctors house. Carrie Jamieson her lifelong friend was also in Edinburgh at the same time studying nursing. Later Annie returned to Fetlar and married John Robertson, they had one daughter Eileen. After her return to Fetlar she undertook a vast amount of voluntary work in the community, along with John, assisting many community organisations. She also provided care to a number of her own and her husbands family. Annie had a tremendous memory and could personally remember when the island had a population of well over 200. She told many stories of her experiences which were a delight to listen to, and she was delighted when people would come along for a yarn. She will be sadly missed by everyone.
