Fetlar Pier and Breakwater - Contract Awarded

At last! After many years waiting Fetlar will soon have a new pier and breakwater.

Contractors Frank L Johnson have been awarded the £3.5 million contract and hope to begin work by early December.

As well as providing shelter for the ferry a new slipway will be included as will a berthing face capable of taking up to three 10m sized boats alongside.

In parallel with the pier project another project to bring a mains water supply to the West side of the island including the pier is taking shape.

Healthy interest in Fetlar properties

There has been a good interest in properties for sale on Fetlar recently. South Dale is listed as being under offer and the closing date for Da Haa at Funzie was 12th at 12 noon. Hopefully we should know who the new owners of these properties are soon.


Fetlar cafe
