HANDMADE IN FETLAR

Calling all knitters, stitchers, spinners, weavers, painters, jewellers, carvers, quilters, sculptors, artists, card-makers...

We would like to expand the quantity and range of crafts that we sell at Fetlar Interpretive Centre for next season. We will also be increasing the amount of display space available for craft sales within the Centre. So this is an early call to all craft makers in Fetlar to start thinking ahead about what items you might wish to make to offer for sale in the Centre for the 2012 season.

Having a strong local Fetlar identity is important to craft-makers and craft-buyers alike, so we will be promoting craft sales under the name of **HANDMADE IN FETLAR**. Traditional and contemporary craft items are welcome.

Fetlar Interpretive Centre's 2012 season starts on 1st May. Ideally, craft items should be ready for submission towards the middle / end of April 2012 to give us enough time to prepare our sales displays before we welcome our first visitors of the new season.

Four good reasons...

- The maker sets his or her own price for items. The price you wish to charge is your decision.
- You tell us the price you would like to receive for each item. Fetlar Interpretive Centre then adds a modest commission to each price. The ticket price shown and charged to customers in Fetlar Interpretive Centre includes this small commission. Each craft item sold then earns its maker the full price that he or she set, plus the added commission included in the ticket price generates a little income for Fetlar Interpretive Centre.
- Craft items are accepted on a 'sale or return' basis, so that items that do not sell can be returned to their maker at the end of the season.
- Don't be shy! Selling your crafts could be a good way of earning some extra income. If you have not sold your handcrafts before, why not start by offering some items for sale through Fetlar Interpretive Centre?

Wildlife review

How did the phalaropes do this year? This summer you had 16 of these stunning little waders breeding 'on your doorstep'. Thankfully, numbers are steadily increasing since they hit a worrying low in 2007. The Shetland cattle that have been grazing have probably helped. Since the cattle went into the mires we've recorded increases in breeding phalaropes, lapwings, redshanks and curlews too.

The strong westerly winds this September have carried a few rare birds with them all the way from North America. Among them was a grey-cheeked thrush – a rare visitor to Britain. It is a tiny thrush, not much bigger than a wheatear that breeds in Canada. Other more common American visitors in Fetlar this September were; a pectoral sandpiper and several American golden plovers.
